The HOA board is already hard at work for 2023, planning more great events for our community.

#### **Starting 2023**

The HOA board is looking forward to this upcoming year while always keeping in mind the six "Ps": Prior Proper Planning Prevents Poor Performance!

Here are some of the goals the HOA board will be tackling this year.

• We are tasking our landscaper with creating a 5-year master plan for the community, which is now over 20 years old. Many of the plants and hedges are in need of replacement in order to remain healthy and attractive. Additionally, some of the cul-de-sacs have never had an irrigation system installed, so they must be brought up to modern standards with the

- This year, we are planning to have a registered arborist assess the health of all the oaks in the park and determine if any need to be removed. Additionally, we have budgeted for the trees to be trimmed which will allow them to remain healthy. This is a necessary step, as these oaks have not been attended to in many years and could fall if left unchecked.
- In response to feedback from our homeowners, we are exploring the possibility of adding several new improvements to the community. These include:
  - o Adding Pickle Ball court lines to the Tennis Court
  - o Creating a dog park
  - o Replacing or restoring the community bulletin board
  - o Annual sidewalk power washing changes
  - Fixing the cracks in the pool
  - Restoring the village signs.

#### **Up Coming Events for 2023**

March - our annual Basketball Tournament - we are also looking to expand this with another event.

April - our annual Easter Egg Hunt. Additionally, we will have our annual community-wide yard sale and electronic recycling.

May - our annual Mother's Day Charity Gift Fair, vendors from across the state will participate. We are also looking into having a Mother's Day Brunch in the park

July - our annual Freedom Fest to celebrate the 4th of July.

October - our annual Haunted Oaks Halloween treat.

December - Holiday Celebration with Santa & Newsome HS choir and orchestra.
